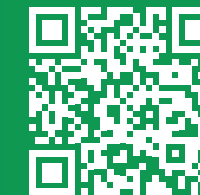

## In Discipleship

“The energy and passion of over 400 students coming together was palpable,” reflected Deacon Steve Washek, director of Faith Formation for the Diocese of Erie.

The diocesan-wide day-long confirmation retreat, a new initiative by the Office of Faith Formation, brought together students preparing for confirmation from across the region. Deacon Washek continued: “This retreat was a unique opportunity to help discover God and the offerings of faith for those who follow him.”

Moments of adoration and confession became transformative experiences for many. As the event culminated with a Mass offered by Bishop Lawrence Persico, the magnitude of its impact on the spiritual growth of the youth was evident.

Rather than being handed a bag of pre-selected food items, for instance, food pantry clients can make their own choices. “They get to choose a certain number of vegetables, the kinds of soups they like, cereal products and more,” says Jessica Struthers, who oversees the St. Elizabeth Center.

Volunteers in the center’s thrift shop also create a boutique look for those in need of clothing. The latest addition? A pop-up dressing room so people no longer have to guesstimate whether or not something suits them.
